Abstract

SARS-CoV-2 is a member of the Coronaviridae family, which comprises many virulent strains that infect humans and animals, including SARS-CoV and Middle East respiratory syndrome CoV (MERS- CoV. The Covid-19 epidemic continues to rage, especially in countries that have been unable or unwilling to institute strong public health measures. In late December 2019, an outbreak of pneumonia of unknown aetiology linked to the Huanan seafood market, Wuhan, China was officially reported by the Health Commission of Hubei province, China. The virus was officially named SARS-CoV -2 and the disease as COVID-19. The rapid global spread and alarming rise in the number and severity of the cases necessitated devising early therapeutics and preventive measures against COVID-19. To date, a number of CoV vaccines have been licensed for use in domestic animals against canine CoV, feline CoV, bovine CoV (BCoV), porcine epidemic diarrhoea virus, transmissible gastroenteritis virus (TGEV) and infectious bronchitis virus (IBV). On 16 January 2021 India started its national vaccination programme against the SARS-CoV-2 virus which has caused the COVID-19 pandemic.
