HENOCH –SCHONLEIN PURPURA- A CASE REPORT

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ABSTRACT

Background: Although Henoch-Schonlein purpura (HSP) in elderly people is so relatively rare, this case study was done to help improve HSP diagnosis and treatment. Presentation of a case HSP symptoms in a 74-year-old female had been documented. The patient's history, physical exam, lab tests, and results had been obtained. In addition, she experienced severe gastrointestinal symptoms as vomiting, stomach discomfort, loose stools, etc. A biochemistry lab test indicated a slight rise in creatinine (, uric acid, and CRP. The lab reports' renal involvement is a significant strike to HSP.*Discussion*: In order to lower mortality, poor prognosis in the management of HSP in the elderly requires greater focus. It is difficult to manage HSP in elderly people since it is a rare condition which frequently manifests in severe ways.
